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# **Chapter 1 Overview**

### 1.1 Device Description

The digital night vision monocular can perform in all ambient light. It has an advanced HD sensor and a high resolution OLED display, which provides full-color clarity in daytime and classic black & white viewing at night. This device meets the needs of professional hunters who value traditions and seek technological superiority. The device is applicable for scenarios such as field and forest hunting, hiking, and rescuing.

### 1.2 Main Function

- Built-in Adjustable IR Emitter: With optional IR emitter, the device can be used in total darkness and view targets clearly.
- Built-in Laser Rangefinder: The device allows you to determine the distance in various scenarios with built-in laser rangefinder module.
- Display Mode: The device supports multiple display modes, and you can set day mode, night mode, defog mode, or auto mode according to the scene.
- Zeroing: The reticle helps you to aim at the target fast and accurately. See Zeroing.
- App Connection: The device can capture snapshots, record videos, and set parameters by HIKMICRO Sight App after being connected to your phone via hotspot.




Figure 1-1 Device Appearance

No.	Description	Function
1	Lens Cover	Protect the lens.
2	Focus Ring	Adjust the focus to find clear targets.
3	Power Key	<ul><li>Press: standby mode/wake up device</li><li>Hold: power on/off</li></ul>
4	Laser Key	<ul> <li>Hold: switch display modes</li> <li>Press: start laser ranging</li> <li>Double Press: Turn off laser ranging</li> </ul>
5	Wheel	<ul><li>Press: start/stop recording</li><li>Hold: menu operation</li><li>Double press: display/hide OSD</li></ul>
6	Fixing Ring	Fix the clip-on eyepiece to the device.

# **Chapter 2 Preparation**

### 2.1 Cable Connection

Connect the device and power adaptor with a type-C cable to power on the device. Alternatively, connect the device and PC to export files.

### **Steps**

- 1. Lift the cable interface cover.
- 2. Connect the device and power adapter with a Type-C cable to power on the device. Alternatively, connect the device and PC to export files.




Figure 2-1 Cable Connection

# 2.2 Install Adapter

#### **Steps**

- 1. Make sure the red dot of the adapter align with the red dot of the eyepiece, and insert the adapter as arrow 1.
- 2. Rotate the locking ring anticlockwise (as arrow 2 shows).




Figure 2-2 Install Adapter

**Note** 

- The selectable types of the adapter are 38, 40, 50, and 62.
- Please purchase the adapter separately.

### 2.3 Remove Adapter

#### **Steps**

- 1. Rotate only the locking ring clockwise, and make sure the device or other parts of the adapter are not rotated or moved.
- 2. Plug out the adapter after it is loosen.

### 2.4 Install Daylight Scope

You can use the device together with a daylight scope to view the target clear in daytime.

### **Steps**

- 1. Install the daylight scope into the transfer ring as arrow 1.
- 2. Lock the buckle to fix the daylight scope as arrow 2.




Figure 2-3 Install Daylight Scope

# 2.5 Install Battery

### 2.5.1 Battery Instruction

- Charge the battery for 4 hours before the first use.
- Remove the battery from the battery compartment if the device is not used for a long

time.

• The battery size is 19 mm × 70 mm. The rated voltage is 3.6 VDC, and the battery capacity is 3200 mAh.

### 2.5.2 Battery Installation

Insert the batteries into the battery compartment.

### **Steps**

1. Turn the battery cover anticlockwise to loosen it.




Figure 2-4 Open Battery Cover

2. Insert the battery into the battery compartment with the positive mark inward.





Figure 2-5 Install Battery

3. Turn the battery cover clockwise to tighten it.

### 2.6 Power On/Off

#### Power On

When the battery is sufficiently charged, hold  $\circlearrowleft$  to power on the device.

#### **Power Off**

When the device is turned on, hold  $\circlearrowleft$  to power off the device.

#### **Auto Power Off**

Set the auto power off time for your device, and then the device will automatically shut down as the set time.

#### **Steps**

- 2. Rotate the wheel to select (1).
- 3. Press and rotate the wheel to the auto power-off time as required.
- 4. Hold the wheel to save and exit.

### Note

- See the battery icon for the battery status. means the battery is fully charged, and means that the battery is low.
- When the low power note shows, charge the battery.
- The auto power off takes effect only when the device enters the standby mode and the device isn't connected with HIKMICRO Sight app at the same time.
- The auto power off countdown will start again when the device reenters standby mode, or the device is restarted.

### 2.7 Menu Description

When the device is turned on, hold the wheel to show the menu.

In the menu, you can rotate the wheel to select functions, press the wheel to configure the selected function, and hold the wheel to exit the menu.

### 2.8 App Connection

Connect the device to the HIKMICRO Sight App via hotspot, then you can capture picture, record video, or configure parameters on your phone.

### **Steps**

1. Search the HIKMICRO Sight on App Store (iOS System) or Google Play™ (Android System) to download it, or scan the QR code to download and install the app.

- 2. In the menu, rotate the wheel to select \( \omega \).
- 3. Press and rotate the wheel to select Hotspot.
- 4. Turn on the WLAN of your phone and connect to the hotspot.
  - Hotspot Name: HIK-IPTS Serial No.
  - Hotspot Password: Serial No.
- 5. Open the app and connect your phone with the device. You can view the interface of device on your phone.

### ☐iNote

• The device cannot connect to the app if you enter wrong password several times.

Refer to *Restore Device* to reset the device, and connect the app again.

 The device should be activated for the first use. The default password must be changed after the activation.

### 2.9 Firmware Status

### 2.9.1 Check Firmware Status

### **Steps**

- 1. Open HIKMICRO Sight and connect your device to the app.
- 2. Check if there is an upgrade prompt on the device management interface. If there is no upgrade prompt, the firmware is the latest version. Otherwise, the firmware is not the latest version.




Figure 2-8 Check Firmware Status

3. (Optional) If the firmware is not the latest version, upgrade the device. See *Upgrade Device*.

### 2.9.2 Upgrade Device

### Upgrade Device via HIKMICRO Sight

#### **Before You Start**

Install HIKMICRO Sight on your phone and connect your device to the app.

#### Steps

- 1. Tap the upgrade prompt to enter the firmware upgrade interface.
- 2. Tap **Upgrade** to start upgrade.



The upgrading operation may vary due to app updates. Please take the actual app version for reference.

### **Upgrade Device via PC**

#### **Before You Start**

- Please get the upgrade package first.
- Turn on the device after connecting it to your PC, and keep the device on for 10 to 15 seconds before other operations.

### **Steps**

- 1. Connect the device to your PC with cable, and then turn on the device.
- 2. Open the detected disk, copy the upgrade file and paste it to the root directory of the device.
- 3. Hold  $\circlearrowleft$  to reboot the device, and the device upgrades automatically. The upgrading process will be displayed in the main interface.



During the upgrade package transmission, make sure the device is connected to your PC. Otherwise, it may cause unnecessary upgrade failure, firmware damage, etc.

### 2.10 Calibrate Image

You can adjust and save the position of the image window for different users. See *Calibrate Image* for detailed instructions.






Figure 2-9 Image Calibration Effect

### 2.11 Zeroing

You can enable the reticle to view the position of the target. The functions such as freeze help to adjust the reticle more accurately. See *Zeroing* for detailed instructions.

# **Chapter 3 Image Settings**

### 3.1 Adjust Focus

### **Steps**

- 1. Power on the device.
- 2. Hold the device and make sure the eyepiece covers your eye.
- 3. Adjust the focus ring until the image is clear.




Figure 3-1 Adjust Focus

**Note** 

When focusing, do not touch the surface of lens to avoid smearing the lens.

## 3.2 Adjust Brightness

### **Steps**

- 1. In the menu, select , and press the wheel to confirm.
- 2. Rotate the wheel to adjust brightness.
- 3. Hold the wheel to save and exit.

### 3.3 Adjust Contrast

#### **Steps**

- 1. In the menu, select , and press the wheel to confirm.
- 2. Rotate the wheel to adjust contrast.
- 3. Hold the wheel to save and exit.

### 3.4 Set Smart IR

Image overexposure may occur in too bright environment. The smart IR function helps to adjust the overexposed images, and it can improve the image effect in night mode by adjusting the brightness of the supplement light.

### **Steps**

- 1. In the menu, select (i), and press the wheel to confirm.
- 2. Rotate the wheel to switch mode.
  - Smart IR: Switch to smart IR, then the device can automatically adjust the IR light intensity according to the environment brightness.
  - High/Medium/Low: Select the IR light intensity from high, medium, or low as needed.
- 3. Hold the wheel to save and exit.

### 3.5 Set Display Mode

You can select different display modes in different scenes.

Hold \* in live view interface to switch display modes. Day, night, defog, and auto are selectable.




Figure 3-2 Display Mode

# 3.6 Calibrate Image

You can adjust and save the position of the image window for different users.

### Steps

- 1. In the menu, select 🔲 .
- 2. Select \_\_, and press and rotate the wheel to switch calib. profiles. You can set 5 calib. profiles.
- 3. Select , and press the wheel to enable reference line. Make sure the reference line is horizontal in the screen.
- 4. (Optional) Select \*\*, and press the wheel to freeze the image.
- 5. Select , and press the wheel to start calibration.
- 6. Press the wheel to select **X** or **Y** axis, and rotate the wheel to set the coordinates until the window reaches the target position.

7. (Optional) Select o, and press the wheel to confirm. Press **OK** to restore the view to default position, and **CANCEL** to return to the setting interface according to the prompt.



The default position of image window may not be exactly at zero (X = 0, Y = 0). This is caused by slight individual differences of optical components, and it is a normal phenomenon.

8. Hold the wheel to exit image calibration.

# **Chapter 4 Zeroing**

### 4.1 Set Reticle Style

You can select color and type for your reticle in different environments.

#### **Before You Start**

Select a reticle No. you want to correct first.

#### **Steps**

- 1. In the zeroing interface, select 💠 or 🗘 and press the wheel to confirm.
- 2. Rotate the wheel to switch reticle type and color.
- 3. Hold the wheel to exit the interface according to the prompt.
  - **OK:** Save the parameter and exit.
  - Cancel: Exit but not save the parameters.

### 4.2 Correct Reticle

Correcting the reticle can help you aim at the target with high accuracy by marking the offset between the big reticle and small reticle. Functions such as **Freeze** help to adjust the reticle more accurately.

#### **Steps**

- 1. In the menu, select  $\bigoplus$  and press the wheel to enter zeroing interface.
- 2. Select a zeroing No. You can set 5 reticles.
  - a) Rotate the wheel to select ; and press the wheel to confirm.
  - b) Rotate the wheel to select a zeroing No. to correct.
  - c) Press the wheel again to confirm.
- 3. Set distance to target.
  - a) Rotate the wheel to select 📵 , and press the wheel to switch the digit.
  - b) Rotate the wheel to change the number.
  - c) Press the wheel again to confirm.
- 4. Aim at the target and pull the trigger, and align the reticle with the point of impact.

- a) Rotate the wheel to select  $\frac{1}{2}$ , press the wheel to freeze the image.
- b) Select and press the wheel to press the wheel to set the coordinates until the big reticle aligns with the point of impact. Press the wheel to select **X** or **Y** Axis. If you select X-axis, the reticle moves left and right; if you select Y-axis, the reticle moves up and down.




Figure 4-1 Correct Reticle

### **i**Note

- When you switch the zeroing No., a prompt will appear on the interface. Select OK to save the parameters for the current reticle.
- When enabling the freeze function in reticle, you can adjust the position of the cursor on a frozen image. This function can prevent image flutter.
- 5. Hold the wheel to exit the interface according to the prompt.
  - OK: Save the parameters and exit.
  - **CANCEL**: Exit but not save the parameters.
- 6. Pull the trigger again to verify that the aiming point aligns with the point of impact.
- 7. (Optional) Repeat 2 to 6 to set the position for other reticles in this zeroing profile.

# **Chapter 5 Measure Distance**

The device can detect the distance between the target and the observation position with laser.

#### **Before You Start**

When measuring the distance, keep the hand and the position steady. Otherwise, the accuracy may be affected.

### Steps

- 1. In the menu, rotate the wheel to select  $\frac{1}{100}$ , and press the wheel to confirm.
- 2. Rotate the wheel to select a laser ranging mode. The device measures the distance continuously, and the measurement duration can be selected. The measurement result will be refreshed every 1 s.
- 3. Hold the wheel to return to the live view interface.
- 4. Aim the cursor at the target and press \* to measure the target distance.

#### Result

The distance measurement result is displayed at the upper center of the image.

# **Chapter 6 General Settings**

You can manually record video or capture picture when displaying live view.

### 6.1 Set OSD

You can choose whether to display the OSD information on the live view mode in this function.

#### **Steps**

- 1. In menu, select 🔀 **Function Settings** and press the wheel to confirm.
- 2. Rotate the wheel to select \( \limits \), and press the wheel to enter the setting interface.
- 3. Rotate the wheel to select OSD and press the wheel to enable it.
- Rotate the wheel to select **Date** or **Time**, and press the wheel to display or hide the information.
- 5. Hold the wheel to save and exit.

### 6.2 Set Brand Logo

You can add brand logo on the live view interface.

#### **Steps**

- 1. In the menu, select 📴 **Function Settings**, and press the wheel to enter the sub-menu.
- 2. Rotate the wheel to select  $\triangle$ , and press the wheel to enable **Brand Logo**.
- 3. Hold the wheel to save the settings and exit.

#### Result

The brand logo is displayed at the bottom left of the image.

### 6.3 Capture Picture

In the main live view interface, press # and wheel at the same time to capture images.

Note

When capturing succeeds, the image freezes for 1 second and a prompt shows on the display.

For exporting captured pictures, refer to *Export Files*.

### 6.4 Set Audio

If you enable the audio function, the sound will be recorded with the video. When there is too loud noise in the video, you can disable this function.

### **Steps**

- 1. In the menu, rotate the wheel to select 🔘 .
- 2. Press the wheel to enable this function.
- 3. Hold the wheel to save and exit.

### 6.5 Record Video

In the live view interface, press the wheel to start recording, and press the wheel again to stop recording.

Note

The recording time is displayed at left top of the image. For exporting recording files, refer to *Export Files*.

### 6.6 Prerecord Video

After you enable this function and select the prerecording time, the device can automatically start recording the 7, 10 or 15 seconds before the recoil-activation and end recording the 7, 10 or 15 seconds after the recoil-activation.

### **Steps**

- 1. In the menu, select , and press the wheel to confirm.
- 2. Rotate the wheel to switch the prerecording time. 7 s, 10 s, and 15 s are selectable.
- 3. Hold the wheel to save and exit.

**i**Note

If you activate recoils continuously, the device will start recording the 7, 10 or 15 seconds before the first recoil and end recording the 7, 10, or 15 seconds after the last recoil.

#### What to do next

For exporting recording files, refer to Export Files.

### 6.7 Export Files

### 6.7.1 Export Files via HIKMICRO Sight

You can access device albums and export files to your phone via HIKMICRO Sight.

#### **Before You Start**

Install HIKMICRO Sight on your mobile phone.

### **Steps**

- 1. Open HIKMICRO Sight and connect your device to the app. See *App Connection*.
- 2. Tap Media to access device albums.




Figure 6-1 Access Device Albums

- 3. Tap **Local** or **Device** to view the photos and videos.
  - Local: You can view the previous files on the app.
  - **Device**: You can view the files of the current device.

**i**Note

The photos or videos may not show in **Device**. Please pull down to refresh the page.

4. Tap to select a file, and tap **Download** to export the file to your local phone albums.



**i**Note

- Go to Me > About > User Manual on the app to see more detailed operations.
- You can also access device albums by tapping bottom left icon in the live view interface.



• The exporting operation may vary due to app updates. Please take the actual app version for reference.

### 6.7.2 Export Files via PC

This function is used to export recorded videos and captured pictures.

### **Steps**

1. Connect the device and PC with a Type-C cable.



Make sure the device is turned on when connecting the cable.

- 2. Open computer disk and select the disk of device. Go to the **DCIM** folder and find the folder named after the capture year and month. For example, if you capture a picture or record a video on June 2021, go to **DCIM > 202106** to find the picture or video.
- 3. Select and copy the files to PC.
- 4. Disconnect the device from your PC.

**i**Note

- The device displays images when you connect it to PC, but functions such as recording, capturing and hotspot are disabled.
- When you connect the device to PC for the first time, it installs the drive program automatically.

# Chapter 7 System Settings

### 7.1 Adjust Date

#### **Steps**

- 1. In the menu, select O General Settings, and press the wheel to enter the sub-menu.
- 2. Select 📋 .
- 3. Press the wheel to select the year, month, or day, and rotate the wheel to change the number.
- 4. Hold the wheel to save settings and exit.

### 7.2 Synchronize Time

### **Steps**

- 1. In the menu, select O General Settings, and press the wheel to enter the sub-menu.
- 2. Select 🕔 .
- 3. Press and rotate the wheel to switch the clock system. 24-hour and 12-hour clock are selectable. If you select 12-hour clock, press and rotate the wheel to select AM or PM.
- 4. Press the wheel to select the hour or minute, and rotate the wheel to change the number.
- 5. Hold the wheel to save settings and exit.

### 7.3 Set Language

You can select the device language in this function.

#### **Steps**

- 1. In the menu, select O General Settings, and press the wheel to enter the sub-menu.
- 2. Select (iii), and press the wheel to enter the language configuration interface.
- 3. Rotate the wheel to select the language as required, and press the wheel to confirm.
- 4. Hold the wheel to exit.

### 7.4 Set Unit

You can switch the unit for the distance measurement function and the reticle function.

### **Steps**

- 1. In the menu, select O General Settings, and press the wheel to enter the sub-menu.
- 2. Select , and press the wheel to confirm.
- 3. Rotate the wheel to select yard or m.
- 4. Hold the wheel to save settings and exit.

### 7.5 View Device Information

- 2. Select (i), and press the wheel. You can view the device information such as version, and serial No.

### 7.6 Restore Device

### **Steps**

- 1. In the menu, select O General Settings, and press the wheel to enter the sub-menu.
- 2. Select , and press the wheel to restore the device to defaults according to the prompt.

# **Chapter 8 Frequently Asked Questions**

### 8.1 Why is the monitor off?

Check the following items.

- Check whether the device is off-battery.
- Check the monitor after charging the device for 5 minutes.

### 8.2 The image is not clear, how to adjust it?

Adjust the focus ring until the image is clear. Refer to Adjust Focus.

### 8.3 Capturing or recording fails. What's the problem?

Check the following items.

- Whether the device is connected to your PC. Capturing or recording is disabled in this status.
- Whether the storage space is full.
- Whether the device is low-battery.

### 8.4 Why the PC cannot identify the device?

Check the following items.

- Whether the device is connected to your PC with supplied USB cable.
- If you use other USB cables, make sure the cable length is no longer than 1 m.

# **Safety Instruction**

### Transportation

- Keep the device in original or similar packaging while transporting it.
- Keep all wrappers after unpacking them for future use. In case of any failure occurred, you need to return the device to the factory with the original wrapper. Transportation without the original wrapper may result in damage on the device and the company shall not take any responsibilities.
- DO NOT drop the product or subject it to physical shock. Keep the device away from magnetic interference.

### **Power Supply**

- Please purchase the adapter by yourself. Input voltage should meet the Limited Power Source (5 VDC, 2A) according to the IEC62368 standard. Please refer to technical specifications for detailed information.
- Use the power adapter provided by qualified manufacturer. Refer to the product specification for detailed power requirements.
- Make sure the plug is properly connected to the power socket.
- DO NOT connect multiple devices to one power adapter, to avoid over-heating or fire hazards caused by overload.
- The battery charger is included in the package. The input voltage for the supplied battery

- charger should meet the Limited Power Source (5 VDC, 2 A).
- The power source should meet limited power source or PS2 requirements according to IEC 62368-1 standard.

### **Battery**

- Improper use or replacement of the battery may result in explosion hazard. Replace with the same or equivalent type only.
- The battery type is 18650 with the protection board. The battery size is 19 mm × 70 mm. The rated voltage is 3.6 VDC, and the battery capacity is 3200 mAh. Dispose of used batteries in conformance with the instructions provided by the battery manufacturer.
- Make sure the battery temperature is between 0 °C to 45 °C (32 °F to 113 °F) when charging.
- For long-term storage of the battery, make sure it is fully charged every half year to ensure the battery quality. Otherwise, damage may occur.
- Do not charge other battery types with the supplied charger. Confirm there is no flammable material within 2 m of the charger during charging.
- DO NOT place the battery near heating or fire source. Avoid direct sunlight.
- DO NOT swallow the battery to avoid chemical burns.
- DO NOT place the battery in the reach of children.
- The battery cannot be charged with external power source directly.
- The device cannot be charged, please use the supplied charger to charge the battery.
- Please purchase the adapter by yourself. The using environment of the adapter should be consistent with that of the device.

#### Maintenance

- If the product does not work properly, please contact your dealer or the nearest service center. We shall not assume any responsibility for problems caused by unauthorized repair or maintenance.
- Wipe the device gently with a clean cloth and a small quantity of ethanol, if necessary.
- If the equipment is used in a manner not specified by the manufacturer, the protection provided by the device may be impaired.
- Clean the lens with soft and dry cloth or wiping paper to avoid scratching it.

### **Using Environment**


- Make sure the running environment meets the requirement of the device. The operating temperature shall be -30°C to 55°C (-22°F to 131°F), and the operating humidity shall be 95% or less.
- DO NOT expose the device to extremely hot, cold, dusty, corrosive, saline-alkali, or damp environments.
- Avoid equipment installation on vibratory surface or places subject to shock (neglect may cause equipment damage).

DO NOT aim the lens at the sun or any other bright light.

### **Emergency**

• If smoke, odor, or noise arises from the device, immediately turn off the power, unplug the power cable, and contact the service center.

#### Laser



When any laser equipment is in use, make sure that the device lens is not exposed to the laser beam, or it may burn out. The laser radiation emitted from the device can cause eye injuries, burning of skin or inflammable substances. Before enabling the

laser ranging function, make sure no human or inflammable substances are in front of the laser lens. Do not place the device where minors can fetch it. The wavelength is 905 nm, and the max. power output is less than 1.328 mW. According to IEC 60825-1:2014 and EN 60825-1:2014+A11:2021, this laser product is classified as Class 1 laser product.
