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1 Overview

HIKMICRO THUNDER ZOOM 2.0 Thermal Image Scope featuring a switchable dual FOV meets different observation requirements. The extrahigh thermal sensitivity ensures perfect detail recognition even in the hardest weather conditions when the object and background are with minimal temperature difference. With an extended operation time, the scope is mainly applied to scenarios such as hunting.

1.1 Main Function

- **Switchable Dual FOV**: The dual FOV meets different observation requirements. Rotate the FOV switch ring to switch the FOV.
- Brightness & Tone Adjustment: You can adjust the brightness and tones as needed.
- Hot Tracking: The device can detect the highest temperature in the scene and mark the spot. This function varies according to different camera models.
- Large Digital Zoom: Digital zoom up to 8× offers better focus on small target from a far distance.
- Zeroing: The reticle helps you to aim at the target fast and accurately.
 See Zeroing.
- Audio & Recoil-activated Recording: The device can record audio and support recoil-activated recording.
- App Connection: The device can capture snapshots, record videos, and set parameters by HIKMICRO Sight app after being connected to your phone via hotspot.

1.2 Appearance

The appearance of the thermal image scope may vary. Please take the actual product for reference.




Figure 1-1 Appearance

2 Preparation

2.1 Install Battery

2.1.1 Battery Instruction

- The device supports removable li-ion battery. The charging limited voltage of the battery is 4.2 V. The battery voltage and capacity is 3.6 V/4.4 Ah (15.84 Wh).
- Charge the battery for more than 4 hours before first use.
- Please purchase the battery recommended by the manufacturer if necessary.
- Remove the battery if the device is not used for a long time.

2.1.2 Change Battery

Insert the battery into the battery compartment.

Before You Start

Make sure to power off the device before removing the battery.

Steps

1. Lift the battery compartment cover handle, and pull the battery compartment cover outwards.




Figure 2-1 Pull Out the Battery Compartment Cover

2. Push the battery latch aside (as the arrow shows), and release the battery.

3. Remove the used battery, and insert the battery into the battery compartment. The latch locks the battery in place when the battery is fully inserted.




Figure 2-3 Insert the Battery

4. Push the battery compartment cover until it clicks into the locked position.

2.2 Cable Connection

Connect the device and power adaptor with a type-C cable to power on the device. Alternatively, connect the device and PC to export files.




Figure 2-4 Cable Connection

2.3 Mount Device on Rail

Before You Start

- Turn off the device first.
- Use the lint-free cloth to clean the device base and the rail.
- The rail is not included in the package. Please purchase it separately.

Steps

- 1. Align the installation holes on the device and the rail.
- 2. Insert the screws, and tighten them.




Figure 2-5 Insert Screws

3. Tighten the screws to secure the rail on the device.




Figure 2-6 Secure the Device

2.4 Power On/Off

Power On

When the device is connected to cable or the battery is enough, hold \circlearrowleft to power on the device.

Power Off

When the device is turned on, hold \circlearrowleft to power off the device.



Note

- Power-off countdown will appear when you power off the device. You
 can press any key to interrupt the countdown and cancel the power-off.
- Automatic low battery power-off cannot be canceled.

Auto Power Off

You can set the auto power off time for your device.

Steps

- 1. Hold to show the main menu.
- 2. Go to 💿 **General Settings**, and select 🔱 .
- 3. Press or to select the auto power off time as required.
- 4. Hold to save and exit.



Note

- When the low power note shows, charge the battery.
- The auto power off takes effect only when you don't operate the device and the device isn't connected with HIKMICRO Sight app at the same time.
- The auto power off countdown will start again when the device reenters standby mode, or the device is restarted.

2.5 Menu Description

2.5.1 Main Menu

In the live view interface, hold to enter or exit the main menu.

- Press to move up.
- Press 🖭 to move down.
- Press to confirm.




Figure 2-7 Main Menu

2.5.2 Quick Menu

In the live view interface, press to show the quick menu. You can set parameters such as **Brightness** and **Contrast** in the quick menu.




This function varies according to different camera models.

2.6 App Connection

Connect the device to the HIKMICRO Sight app via hotspot, then you can capture picture, record video, or configure parameters on your phone.

 Search the HIKMICRO Sight on App Store (iOS System) or Google Play™ (Android System) to download it, or scan the QR code to download and install the app.







iOS System

- 2. Hold 🔳 to show the main menu.
- 3. Press \bigcirc or \bigcirc to select \bigcirc .
- 4. Press to enter the setting interface.
- 5. Press or enabled.
- 6. Turn on the WLAN of your phone and connect to the hotspot.
 - Hotspot Name: HIKMICRO_Serial No.
 - Hotspot Password: Go to Hotspot in the menu to check the password.
- 7. Open the app and connect your phone with the device. You can view the interface of device on your phone.



Note

- The device cannot connect to the app if you enter wrong password several times. Refer to *Restore Device* to reset the device, and connect the app again.
- If the password is not displayed, please upgrade the device to the latest version. Or enter the serial No. as the password.

2.7 Firmware Status

2.7.1 Check Firmware Status

- 1. Open the HIKMICRO Sight and connect your device to the app.
- 2. Check if there is an upgrade prompt on the device management interface. If there is no upgrade prompt, the firmware is the latest version. Otherwise, the firmware is not the latest version.




Figure 2-8 Check Firmware Status

3. (Optional) If the firmware is not the latest version, upgrade the device. See *Upgrade Device*.

2.7.2 Upgrade Device

Upgrade Device via HIKMICRO Sight

Before You Start

Install HIKMICRO Sight on your phone and connect your device to the app.

Steps

- 1. Tap the upgrade prompt to enter the firmware upgrade interface.
- 2. Tap **Upgrade** to start upgrade.



The upgrading operation may vary due to app updates. Please take the actual app version for reference.

Upgrade Device via PC

Before You Start

Please get the upgrade package first.

- 1. Connect the device to your PC with cable.
- 2. Open the detected disk, copy the upgrade file and paste it to the root directory of the device.
- 3. Disconnect the device from your PC.
- 4. Reboot the device, and the device upgrades automatically. The upgrading process will be displayed in the main interface.



Caution

During the upgrade package transmission, make sure the device is connected to your PC. Otherwise, it may cause unnecessary upgrade failure, firmware damage, etc.

2.8 Zeroing (Overview)

You can enable the reticle to view the position of the target. Functions such as freeze and zoom help to adjust the reticle more accurately. See *Zeroing* for detailed instructions.

3 Image Settings

3.1 Adjust Diopter

Steps

- 1. Power on the device.
- 2. Open the lens cover.
- 3. Hold the device and make sure the eyepiece covers your eye.
- 4. Adjust the diopter adjustment ring until the OSD information or image is clear.




Figure 3-1 Adjust Diopter



Note

When adjusting diopter, DO NOT touch the surface of lens to avoid smearing the lens.

3.2 Adjust Focus

- 1. Power on the device.
- 2. Open the lens cover.
- 3. Hold the device and make sure the eyepiece covers your eye.
- 4. Adjust the focus ring until the image is clear.




Figure 3-2 Adjust Focus



Note

When focusing, do not touch the surface of lens to avoid smearing the lens.

3.3 Switch FOV

Rotate the FOV switch ring to switch the FOV of the lens. You can view an icon like 25% on the status bar, which indicates the lens focal length. For example, 25% means the current lens focal length is 25 mm for the wide FOV.




Figure 3-3 Switch FOV

3.4 Adjust Brightness

You can adjust the brightness of the screen in the menu.

- 1. Press 🔳 to show the quick menu.
- 2. Press or to select of and press to confirm.
- 3. Press or 🖭 to adjust brightness.
- 4. Hold is to save settings and exit.

3.5 Adjust Contrast

Steps

- 1. Press 🛅 to show the quick menu.
- 2. Press or 🖭 to select 🌗 and press 🗏 to confirm.
- 3. Press or De to adjust contrast.
- 4. Hold to save settings and exit.

3.6 Adjust Tone

Steps

- 1. In the main menu, select (a) and press (a) to confirm.
- 2. Press or to select a tone. Warm and Cold are selectable.
- 3. Hold to save settings and exit.

3.7 Adjust Sharpness

- 1. In the main menu, select \triangle and press \equiv to confirm.
- 2. Press \bigcirc or $\boxed{{\it P}}$ to adjust sharpness.
- 3. Hold is to save settings and exit.

3.8 Select Scene

You can select proper scene according to actual using scene to improve the display effect.

Steps

- 1. In the main menu, select \longrightarrow and press \equiv to confirm.
- 2. Press or to switch scene.
 - Recognition: Recognition refers to recognition mode and is recommended in normal scene.
 - **Jungle**: Jungle refers to jungle mode and is recommended in hunting environment.
- 3. Hold to save settings and exit.

3.9 Set Palettes

You can select different palettes to display the same scene in different effects. Press in the live view interface to switch palettes.

White Hot

The hot part is light-colored in view. The higher the temperature is, the lighter the color is.




Black Hot

The hot part is black-colored in view. The higher the temperature is, the darker the color is.




Red Hot

The hot part is red-colored in view. The higher the temperature is, the redder the color is.



Fusion

From high temperature to low temperature, the image is colored in from white, yellow, red, pink to purple.



3.10 Correct Defective Pixel

The device can correct the defective pixels on the screen which are not performed as expected.

- 1. In the main menu, select **Function Settings**, and press **to** enter the sub-menu.
- 2. Press or to select , and press to enter the DPC setting interface.
- 3. Press to select **X** or **Y** axis and press to confirm. If you select **X** axis, the cursor moves left and right; if you select **Y** axis, the cursor moves up and down.

- 4. Press or v to move the cursor until it reaches the defective pixel.
- 5. Press twice to correct the dead pixel.




Figure 3-6 Correct Defective Pixel



Note

- The selected defective pixel can be magnified and displayed on the right of the interface.
- If the screen OSD blocks the defective pixel, move the cursor to reach the defective pixel, then the device performs mirror display automatically.

3.11 Flat Field Correction

This function can correct non-uniformity of display.

- 1. In the main menu, select Function Settings and press to confirm.
- 2. Press or to select Image Calib., and press to confirm.
- 3. Press or to select a FFC mode, and press to confirm.
 - Manual FFC: In live view, hold to perform FFC.
 - Auto FFC: The device performs FFC automatically.
 - External: Cover the lens cover, then hold in live view to perform FFC.
- 4. Hold to save and exit.

- Note
- You will hear a click and the image will freeze for a second when the device performs FFC.
- You can also hold to perform FFC in auto FFC mode.

3.12 Set Picture in Picture Mode

Steps

- 1. In the live view interface, hold to enable PIP mode. The details show in the upper center.
 - When reticle is enabled, the PIP view is the detail of reticle.
 - When reticle is not enabled, the PIP view is the detail of central part.

2. Hold to turn off.



Note

If the PIP function is enabled, only the PIP view zooms when adjusting the digital zoom ratio. The digital zoom of PIP view is 2×, 4×, and 8×.

3.13 Adjust Digital Zoom

In the live view interface, press $2 \times 10^{\circ}$ to adjust digital zoom of the device. The live view switches between 1×, 2×, 4×, and 8×.



Note

 When switching the digital zoom ratio, the left interface displays the actual magnification (Actual Magnification = Lens Optical Magnification × Digital Zoom Ratio). For example, the lens optical magnification is

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- $4.3\times$ and the digital zoom ratio is $2\times$, and the actual magnification is $8.6\times$.
- This function varies according to different camera models.

4 Zeroing

4.1 Select Zeroing Profile

You can configure and save the reticle settings in zeroing profiles according to various situation.

Steps

- 1. In the main menu, Press or to select : Press to enter the setting interface.
- 2. Press or to select a zeroing profile.
- 3. Hold to save and exit.

Result

The right top of the image displays the reticle information. For example, A5-109 yard means you are using the No. 5 reticle in zeroing profile A, and the set distance is 109 yard.

Note

There are 5 zeroing profiles in total, and you can configure 5 reticles in each zeroing profile.

4.2 Set Reticle Style

You can select a reticle in the current zeroing profile, and set parameters such as type, color, and position for the reticle.

Before You Start

Select a zeroing profile first.

Steps

- 1. In the main menu, press or rest to select . Press to enter the setting interface.
- 2. Press or 🖭 to select 🛟 or 🛟
- 3. Press or reticle, and press to confirm.
- 4. Hold to exit according to the prompt.
 - OK: Save the parameter and exit.
 - CANCEL: Exit but not save the parameters.

Note

- If the PIP function is enabled, the aimed target can be magnified on the interface.
- In black hot mode and white hot mode, if you set the reticle color as white or black, the color of the reticle will be inverted automatically to better aim at the target.

4.3 Correct Reticle

Correcting the reticle can help you aim at the target with high accuracy by marking the offset between the big reticle and small reticle. Functions such as **Freeze** and **Zoom** help to adjust the reticle more accurately.




Note

- means separate zeroing. You need to zero on wide FOV and narrow FOV respectively.
- on means one-time zeroing. You only need to zero on narrow FOV.
 The device zeros on wide FOV automatically.

Before You Start

Select a zeroing profile first.



- 2. Select a zeroing No. You can set 5 reticles.
 - 1) Press or press to select Zeroing, and press to confirm.
 - 2) Press or to select a reticle to correct.
 - 3) Press again to confirm.
- 3. Select a zeroing mode. Separate zeroing and one-time zeroing are available.
 - If you select one-time zeroing, you need to switch FOV to narrow one first.
 - If you select separate zeroing, you need to zero on wide FOV and narrow FOV respectively. Switch FOV according to the prompt.
- 4. Set the distance to the target.
 - 1) Press or <u>P</u> to select **Distance**.
 - 2) Press 🔳 to select the number you want to change.
 - 3) Press or to change the number, and press to finish the setting.
- 5. Select **Zoom**, and press **to** confirm. Press or **to** set the digital zoom ratio.
- 6. Aim at the target and pull the trigger, and align the reticle with the point of impact.
 - 1) Aim the big reticle at the target.
 - 2) Select * Freeze. Press = to enable the function.
 - 3) Select is to set the coordinates until the big reticle aligns with the point of impact. Press to select X or Y Axis. If you select X axis, the reticle moves left and right; if you select Y axis, the reticle moves up and down.

Note

- When you switch the reticle No., a prompt will appear on the interface.
 Select OK to save the parameters for the current reticle.
- When enabling the freeze function in reticle, you can adjust the position of the cursor on a frozen image. This function can prevent image flutter.
- 7. Hold for next operation according to the prompt.
 - If you select one-time zeroing, hold to exit the interface according to the prompt.
 - OK: Save the parameter and exit.
 - CANCEL: Exit but not save the parameters.
 - If you select separate zeroing, hold is for next operation according to the prompt.
 - Save and Zero: Save the parameters and zero on the other FOV.
 - Save and Exit: Save the parameters zeroing on the current FOV and exit.
 - Cancel: Exit but not save the parameters
- 8. Pull the trigger again to verify that the aiming point aligns with the point of impact.
- 9. (Optional) Repeat 2 to 8 to set the position for other reticles in this zeroing profile.

5 Measure Distance

The device can detect the distance between the target and the observation position with laser.

Before You Start

When measuring the distance, keep the hand and the position steady. Otherwise, the accuracy may be affected.

Steps

- 1. In the main menu, Press or rest to select , and press to enter the measurement interface.
- 2. Set the parameters for the target.
 - 1) Press to show the setting interface. Press or to select the target from **Deer**, **Grey Wolf**, **Brown Bear**, and **Custom**.
 - 2) Press to enter target height configuration interface. Press to select digit, and press or to change the number.



The available height ranges from 0.1 m to 9.0 m.

- 3) Hold to save the settings and return to the distance measurement interface.
- 3. Align the center of top mark with the edge of target top, and press to confirm.
- 4. Align the center of bottom mark with the edge of target bottom, and press is to confirm.

Result

The right top of the image displays the distance measurement result.

6 General Settings

6.1 Set OSD

This function can display or hide the OSD information on the live view interface.

Steps

- 1. In main menu, select 📴 Function Settings.
- 2. Press or to select, and press to enter OSD setting interface.
- 3. Press to enable **OSD** first. You can press or **P** to select and press to display or hide the necessary OSD information.
- 4. Hold to save and exit.



If you turn off **OSD**, all OSD information on the live view will not be displayed.

6.2 Set Brand Logo

You can add brand logo to the live view interface, snapshots, and videos.

Steps

- 1. In the main menu, select \rightleftharpoons Function Settings.
- 2. Press \bigcirc or \bigcirc to select \triangle .
- 3. Press 🔳 to enable **Brand Logo**.
- 4. Hold to save the settings and exit.

Result

The brand logo is displayed at the bottom left of the image.

6.3 Burning Prevention

This function can prevent the detector of the thermal channel from being burned. When you enable this function, the shield will close if the grey scale of the detector reaches a certain value.

Steps

- 1. In the main menu, select **Function Settings** and press **to** confirm.
- 2. Press or r to select .
- 3. Press to enable or disable the function.
- 4. Hold to save settings and exit.



Avoid direct sunlight and enable the burning prevention function to reduce the risk of sensor damage from the heat.

6.4 Capture and Video

6.4.1 Capture Picture

In the live view interface, press to capture picture.



- When capturing succeeds, the image freezes for 1 second and a prompt shows on the display.
- For exporting pictures, refer to *Export Files*.

6.4.2 Set Audio

If you turn on the audio function, the sound will be recorded with the video. When there is too loud noise in the video, you can turn off this function.

- 1. In the main menu, press or ve to select .
- 2. Press 🔳 to enable or disable this function.
- 3. Hold to save settings and exit.

6.4.3 Record Video

Steps

1. In the live view interface, hold to start recording.

The upper left image displays the information of recording time.

2. Hold again to stop recording.

6.4.4 Prerecord Video

After you enable this function and select the prerecording time, the device can automatically start recording the 7 seconds before the recoilactivation and end recording the 7 seconds after the recoil-activation.

Steps

- 1. In the main menu, press or to select .
- 2. Press to enter the setting interface. Press or to enable the function.
- 3. Hold is to save settings and exit.

6.4.5 Hot Tracking

The device can detect the highest temperature spot in the scene and mark it on display.

- 1. In the main menu, press or to select .
- 2. Press 📋 to mark the spot of highest temperature.
- 3. Hold to save the settings and exit.

Result

When the function is enabled, \div displays in the spot of highest temperature. When the scene changes, the \div moves.

6.5 Export Files

6.5.1 Export Files via HIKMICRO Sight

You can access device albums and export files to your phone via HIKMICRO Sight.

Before You Start

Install HIKMICRO Sight on your mobile phone.

- 1. Open HIKMICRO Sight and connect your device to the app. See *App Connection*.
- 2. Tap Media to access device albums.




Figure 6-3 Access Device Albums

- 3. Tap **Local** or **Device** to view the photos and videos.
 - Local: You can view the files captured on app.
 - **Device**: You can view the files of the current device.

Note

The photos or videos may not show in **Device**. Please pull down to refresh the page.

4. Tap to select a file, and tap **Download** to export the file to your local phone albums.

- Go to Me -> About -> User Manual on the app to see more detailed operations.
- You can also access device albums by tapping bottom left icon in the live view interface.
- The exporting operation may vary due to app updates. Please take the actual app version for reference.

6.5.2 Export Files via PC

This function is used to export recorded videos and captured pictures.

Before You Start

Make sure the device is turned on when connecting the cable.

Steps

1. Connect the device and PC with cable.



Note

Make sure the device is turned on when connecting the cable.

- Open computer disk and select the disk of device. Go to the DCIM folder and find the folder named after the capture year and month. For example, if you capture a picture or record a video on February 2024, go to DCIM -> 202402 to find the picture or video.
- 3. Select and copy the files to PC.
- 4. Disconnect the device from your PC.

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Note

- The device displays images when you connect it to PC. But functions such as recording, capturing and hotspot are disabled.
- When you connect the device to PC for the first time, it installs the drive program automatically.

7 System Settings

7.1 Adjust Date

Steps

- 1. In the main menu, select O General Settings.
- 2. Press or to select in and press to enter the configuration interface.
- 3. Press to select the year, month, or day, and press or to change the number.
- 4. Hold to save settings and exit.

7.2 Synchronize Time

Steps

- 1. In the main menu, select O General Settings.
- 2. Press or to select , and press to enter the configuration interface.
- 3. Press or et a switch the clock system. 24-hour and 12-hour clock are selectable. If you select 12-hour clock, press or et and then press or et as to select AM or PM.
- 4. Press to select the hour or minute, and press or to change the number.
- 5. Hold to save settings and exit.

7.3 Set Language

You can select the device language in this function.

Steps

1. In the main menu, select O General Settings.

- 2. Press or to select , and press to enter the configuration interface.
- 3. Press or required, and press to confirm.
- 4. Hold to save settings and exit.

7.4 Set Unit

You can switch the unit for distance measurement.

Steps

- 1. In the main menu, select O General Settings.
- 2. Press or ve to select , and press to enter the configuration interface.
- 3. Press or to select the unit as required.
- 4. Hold to save settings and exit.

7.5 View Device Information

Steps

- 1. In the main menu, select O General Settings.
- 2. Press or to select in, and press to confirm. You can view the device information such as version and serial No.
- 3. Hold is to save settings and exit.

7.6 Restore Device

Steps

- 1. In the main menu, select O General Settings.
- 2. Press or restore to select select select or restore the device to defaults according to the prompt.

8 Frequently Asked Questions

8.1 Why is the monitor off?

Check the following items.

- Check whether the device is off-battery.
- Check the monitor after charging the device for 5 minutes.
- Check whether the device is in standby mode.

8.2 The image is not clear, how to adjust it?

Adjust the diopter adjustment ring or focus ring until the image is clear. Refer to *Adjust Diopter* or *Adjust Focus*.

8.3 Capturing or recording fails. What's the problem?

Check the following items.

- Whether the device is connected to your PC. Capturing or recording is disabled in this status.
- Whether the storage space is full.
- Whether the device is low-battery.

8.4 Why the PC cannot identify the device?

Check the following items.

- Whether the device is connected to your PC with supplied USB cable.
- If you use other USB cables, make sure the cable length is no longer than 1 m.
