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Chapter 1 Overview

1.1 Device Description

HIKMICRO ALPEX digital night vision scope can perform in all ambient light. It has an advanced HD sensor and a high resolution OLED display, which provides full-color clarity in daytime and classic black & white viewing at night. The traditional-style tube meets the needs of professional hunters who value traditions and seek technological superiority, ensuring an extreme detection range of up to 600 meters.

1.2 Main Function

- Distance Measurement: The device can detect the distance between the target and the device.
- Zeroing: The reticle helps you to aim at the target fast and accurately. See Zeroing.
- App Connection: The device can capture snapshots, record videos, and set parameters by HIKMICRO Sight App after being connected to your phone via hotspot.

1.3 Appearance




Figure 1-1 Buttons and Components

2	Focus Ring	Adjusts focus to obtain clear targets.
3	Type-C Interface	To connect the device to power supply or transmit data with a type-C cable.
4	Battery Compartment	For holding the battery.
5	Wheel	Hold: Enter/exit menuRotate: Switch digital zoom
6	Power Key	Press: Standby mode/wake up deviceHold: Power on/off
7	Switch Key	Press: Turn on/off PIPHold: Switch day/night mode
8	Capture Key	Press: Capture snapshotsHold: Start/stop recording
9	Diopter Adjustment Ring	Adjusts the dioptric setting.
10	Eyepiece	The piece placed closest to the eye to view the target.

iNote

Switch reticle: press Capture Key and Switch Key at the same time in the live view mode.

Chapter 2 Preparation

2.1 Cable Connection

Connect the device and power adaptor with a type-C cable to charge the device.




Figure 2-1 Cable Connection

INote

Charge the device for more than 4 hours before first use.

2.2 Install Battery

2.2.1 Battery Instruction

- The external removable battery type is CR123A, and the battery size should be 16.5 mm × 34 mm. The max. rated voltage and capacity are 3 VDC and 1600 mAh.
- The built-in battery type is 18650 with the protection board, and the battery size should be 23 mm × 67 mm. The rated voltage and capacity are 3.6 VDC/3350 mAh (12.18 Wh).
- Install the external battery before the built-in battery runs out, or the device cannot be turned on.
- Do not charge the removable battery in the package.
- Remove the external battery if the device is not used for a long time.

2.2.2 Battery Installation

Insert the batteries into the battery compartment.

Steps

1. Turn the battery cover anticlockwise to loosen it.




Figure 2-2 Loosen the Cover

2. Insert the battery into the battery compartment with the positive mark inward.




Figure 2-3 Install the Battery

3. Turn the battery cover clockwise to tighten it.




Figure 2-4 Tighten the Cover

2.3 Mount Device on Rail

Steps

1. Unscrew the ring top with Allen wrench.




Figure 2-5 Remove the Ring Top

2. Place the device in the bottom half of the ring, and align the top holes with bottom holes.




Figure 2-6 Put the Device to the Ring

3. Insert and tighten the screws.




Figure 2-7 Tighten the Screws

4. Loosen the screws on the bottom half of the ring.




Figure 2-8 Loosen the Screws

5. Attach the bottom half of the ring to the rail, and tighten the screws on the ring. Make sure the device stays level.




Figure 2-9 Tighten the Screws

iNote

- The ring may vary according to different models. Please refer to the actual product.
- The ring is not included in the package, please purchase it in advance.

2.4 Install IR Torch

Steps

1. Open the IR torch bracket, and put the device to IR torch bracket.

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


Figure 2-10 Open the IR Torch Bracket

2. Lock the lever by pressing it to fix the bracket as figure shows.




Figure 2-11 Lock the Lever

3. Turn the IR torch battery cover anticlockwise to remove it, and thread the IR torch through the bracket hoop, then turn the IR torch battery cover clockwise to tighten it.




Figure 2-12 Thread the IR Torch

4. Tighten the screws to fix the IR torch.




Figure 2-13 Fix the IR Torch

iNote

- Rotate the lever to adjust the IR torch bracket. The lever would disassemble if continuously rotating it anticlockwise. Turn the lever clockwise to install it.
- Please ensure the anti-slip pattern of the lever is outward when pressing the lever.

2.5 Power On/Off

Power On

When the battery is sufficiently charged, hold \bigcirc to power on the device.

Power Off

When the device is turned on, hold \bigcirc to power off the device.

iNote

- Power-off countdown will appear when you hold \bigcirc . You can press any key to interrupt the countdown and cancel the power-off.
- Automatic low battery power-off cannot be canceled.

Auto Power Off

You can set the auto power off time for your device.

Steps

- 1. In the menu, select 🧿 General Settings, and press the wheel to confirm.
- 2. Rotate the wheel to select $(\bigcirc$.

- 3. Press and rotate the wheel to the auto power-off time as required.
- 4. Hold the wheel to save and exit.

iNote

- See the battery icon for the battery status. 🖾 means the battery is fully charged,
 - \square means that the battery is low, and \square means the battery charging is abnormal.
- When the low power note shows, charge the battery.
- The auto power off takes effect only when the device enters the standby mode and the device isn't connected with HIKMICRO Sight app at the same time.
- The auto power off countdown will start again when the device reenters standby mode, or the device is restarted.

2.6 Menu Description

When the device is turned on, hold the wheel to show the menu.

In the menu, you can rotate the wheel to select functions, press the wheel to configure the selected function, and hold the wheel to exit the menu.

2.7 App Connection

Connect the device to the HIKMICRO Sight App via hotspot, then you can capture picture,

record video, or configure parameters on your phone.

Steps

1. Search the HIKMICRO Sight on App Store (iOS System) or Google Play[™] (Android System) to download it, or scan the QR code to download and install the app.

- 2. In the menu, rotate the wheel to select $\ \ Q$.
- 3. Press and rotate the wheel to select Hotspot.
- 4. Turn on the WLAN of your phone and connect to the hotspot.
 - Hotspot Name: HIK-IPTS Serial No.
 - Hotspot Password: Serial No.
- 5. Open the app and connect your phone with the device. You can view the interface of device on your phone.

Note

- The device cannot connect to the app if you enter wrong password several times. Refer to *Restore Device* to reset the device, and connect the app again.
- The device should be activated for the first use. The default password must be changed after the activation.

2.8 Firmware Status

2.8.1 Check Firmware Status

Steps

- 1. Open HIKMICRO Sight and connect your device to the app.
- 2. Check if there is an upgrade prompt on the device management interface. If there is no upgrade prompt, the firmware is the latest version. Otherwise, the firmware is not the latest version.




Figure 2-15 Check Firmware Status

3. (Optional) If the firmware is not the latest version, upgrade the device. See *Upgrade Device*.

2.8.2 Upgrade Device

Upgrade Device via HIKMICRO Sight

Before You Start

Install HIKMICRO Sight on your phone and connect your device to the app.

Steps

- 1. Tap the upgrade prompt to enter the firmware upgrade interface.
- 2. Tap **Upgrade** to start upgrade.

iNote

The upgrading operation may vary due to app updates. Please take the actual app version for reference.

Upgrade Device via PC

Before You Start

- Please get the upgrade package first.
- Turn on the device after connecting it to your PC, and keep the device on for 10 to 15 seconds before other operations.

Steps

- 1. Connect the device to your PC with cable, and then turn on the device.
- 2. Open the detected disk, copy the upgrade file and paste it to the root directory of the device.
- 3. Hold \bigcirc to reboot the device, and the device upgrades automatically. The upgrading process will be displayed in the main interface.

iNote

During the upgrade package transmission, make sure the device is connected to your PC. Otherwise, it may cause unnecessary upgrade failure, firmware damage, etc.

2.9 Zeroing

You can enable the reticle to view the position of the target. The functions such as freeze and zoom help to adjust the reticle more accurately. See *Zeroing* for detailed instructions.

Chapter 3 Image Settings

3.1 Adjust Diopter

Steps

- 1. Power on the device.
- 2. Open the lens cover.
- 3. Hold the device and make sure the eyepiece covers your eye.
- 4. Adjust the diopter adjustment ring until the OSD text or image is clear.




Figure 3-1 Adjust Diopter

iNote

When adjusting diopter, DO NOT touch the surface of lens to avoid smearing the lens.

3.2 Adjust Focus

Steps

- 1. Power on the device.
- 2. Hold the device and make sure the eyepiece covers your eye.
- 3. Adjust the focus ring until the image is clear.




Figure 3-2 Adjust Focus

INote

When focusing, do not touch the surface of lens to avoid smearing the lens.

3.3 Adjust Brightness

Steps

- 1. In the menu, select $-\dot{\Box}$, and press the wheel to confirm.
- 2. Rotate the wheel to adjust brightness.
- 3. Hold the wheel to save and exit.

3.4 Adjust Contrast

Steps

- 1. In the menu, select (), and press the wheel to confirm.
- 2. Rotate the wheel to adjust contrast.
- 3. Hold the wheel to save and exit.

3.5 Switch Day and Night

In live view mode, hold M to switch the day and night mode.

3.6 Set Smart IR

Image overexposure may occur in too bright environment. The smart IR function helps to adjust the overexposed images by controlling infrared light intensity, so as to improve the image effect in night mode and dark environment.

In menu, select 🔯 and press the wheel to enable this function.

3.7 Set Picture in Picture Mode

Steps

- 1. In the menu, select 📃 .
- 2. Press the wheel to enable PIP function. The details show in the upper center of the view.
 - When reticle is enabled, the PIP view is the detail of reticle.
 - When reticle is not enabled, the PIP view is the detail of central part.

3. Hold the wheel to exit.

⊡Note

In the live view mode, press \mathbb{I} to enable PIP quickly.

3.8 Adjust Digital Zoom

You can zoom in and out the image by using this function.

Steps

- 1. In the menu, select (+), and press the wheel to confirm.
- 2. Rotate the wheel to select a zoom mode.
 - Multiple: The digital zoom ratio can be set to 1×, 2×, and 4×.
 - **Continuous**: The digital zoom ratio can be set from 1.0× to 4.0× continuously.
- 3. Hold the wheel to save and exit.
- 4. In the live view interface, rotate the wheel to switch the digital zoom of the device.

iNote

When switching the digital zoom ratio, the top-left corner of interface displays the actual magnification (Actual Magnification = Lens Optical Magnification × Digital Zoom Ratio). For example, the lens optical magnification is 2.8× and the digital zoom ratio is 2×, and the actual magnification is 5.6×.

Chapter 4 Zeroing

4.1 Select Zeroing Profile

If different users use the same device, the users can configure and save the reticle settings in their respective reticle group.

Steps

- 1. In the menu, select \bigcirc , and press the wheel to confirm.
- 2 Rotate the wheel to switch the zeroing profile.
- 3. Hold the wheel to save and exit.

Result

The right top of the image displays the reticle information. For example, A5-109 yard means you are using the No. 5 reticle in zeroing profile A, and the set distance is 109 yard.




Figure 4-1 Using a Reticle

⊡iNote

- There are 5 zeroing profiles in total, and you can configure 5 reticles in each zeroing profile.
- You can press in and in at the same time to switch the reticles in the selected zeroing profile in the live view interface.

4.2 Set Reticle Style

You can select color and type for your reticle in different environments.

Before You Start

Select a reticle No. you want to correct first.

Steps

- 1. In the zeroing interface, select \Leftrightarrow or \Leftrightarrow and press the wheel to confirm.
- 2. Rotate the wheel to switch reticle type and color.
- 3. Hold the wheel to exit the interface according to the prompt.
 - **OK:** Save the parameter and exit.
 - Cancel: Exit but not save the parameters.

4.3 Correct Reticle

Correcting the reticle can help you aim at the target with high accuracy by marking the offset between the big reticle and small reticle. Functions such as **Freeze** and **Zoom** help to adjust the reticle more accurately.

Before You Start

Select a zeroing profile first.

Steps

1. In the menu, select \bigoplus and press the wheel to enter zeroing interface.

2. Select a reticle No. You can set 5 reticles.

- a) Rotate the wheel to select 4^{m} , and press the wheel to confirm.
- b) Rotate the wheel to select a reticle No. to correct.
- c) Press the wheel again to confirm.
- 3. Set distance to the target.
 - a) Rotate the wheel to select 1, and press the wheel to switch the digit.
 - b) Rotate the wheel to change the number.
 - c) Press the wheel again to confirm.

4. Select \bigcirc , and press the wheel confirm. Rotate the wheel to enlarge the image until the target positions is clear enough.

5. Aim at the target and pull the trigger, and align the reticle with the point of impact.

- a) Aim the big reticle at the target.
- b) Rotate the wheel to select $\frac{1}{2}$, press the wheel to freeze the image.
- c) Select \square and press the wheel to set the coordinates until the big reticle aligns with the point of impact. Press the wheel to select X or Y Axis. If you select X-axis, the reticle moves left and right; if you select Y-axis, the reticle moves up and down.

⊡Note

- When you switch the reticle No., a prompt will appear on the interface. Select **OK** to save the parameters for the current reticle.
- When enabling the freeze function in reticle, you can adjust the position of the cursor on a frozen image. This function can prevent image flutter.
- 6. Hold the wheel to exit the interface according to the prompt.
 - **OK:** Save the parameters and exit.
 - CANCEL: Exit but not save the parameters.
- 7. Pull the trigger again to verify that the aiming point aligns with the point of impact.
- 8. (Optional) Repeat 2 to 7 to set the position for other reticles in this zeroing profile.

Chapter 5 Measure Distance

The device can detect the distance between the target and the observation position.

Before You Start

When measuring the distance, keep the hand and the position steady. Otherwise, the accuracy may be affected.

Steps

- 1. In the menu, select $\langle \rangle$, and press the wheel to go to the setting interface.
- 2. Set the parameters for the target.
 - 1) Rotate the wheel to select the target from **Deer**, **Grey Wolf**, **Brown Bear**, and **Custom**.
 - 2) Press and rotate the wheel to set target height.

iNote

The available height ranges from 0.1 m to 9.0 m.

- 3) Press the wheel to confirm.
- 4) Hold the wheel to save the settings and return to the distance measurement interface.
- 3. Align the center of top mark with the edge of target top, and press the wheel to confirm.

4. Align the center of bottom mark with the edge of target bottom, and press the wheel to confirm.

Result

The right top of the image displays the distance measurement result and the height of the target.




Figure 5-1 Measurement Result

Chapter 6 General Settings

6.1 Set OSD

You can choose whether to display the OSD information on the live view interface in this function.

Steps

- 1. In the menu, select 🛬 Function Settings, and press the wheel to enter the sub-menu.
- 2. Rotate the wheel to select []], and press the wheel to enter the OSD setting interface.
- 3. Rotate the wheel to select the OSD information you want to display or not.
- 4. Press the wheel to enable the selected OSD information.

iNote

If you turn off **OSD**, all OSD information on the live view will not be displayed.

6.2 Set Brand Logo

You can add brand logo on the live view interface.

Steps

- 1. In the menu, select 🗦 Function Settings, and press the wheel to enter the sub-menu.
- 2. Rotate the wheel to select 2, and press the wheel to enable **Brand Logo**.
- 3. Hold the wheel to save the settings and exit.

Result

The brand logo is displayed at the bottom left of the image.

6.3 Capture and Video

6.3.1 Capture Picture

In the view mode, press of to capture a picture.

iNote

When capturing succeeds, the image freezes for 1 second and a prompt shows on the display.

For exporting captured pictures, refer to Export Files.

6.3.2 Set Audio

If you enable the audio function, the sound will be recorded with the video. When there is too loud noise in the video, you can disable this function.

Steps

- 1. In the menu, select 🕠.
- 2. Press the wheel to enable this function.
- 3. Hold the wheel to save and exit.

6.3.3 Record Video

Steps

1. In the live view interface, hold i and start recording.




Figure 6-1 Start Recording

The left top of image displays the information of recording time.

2. Hold i again to stop recording.

What to do next

For exporting recording files, refer to *Export Files*.

6.3.4 Prerecord Video

After you enable this function and select the prerecording time, the device can automatically start recording the 7, 10 or 15 seconds before the recoil-activation and end recording the 7, 10 or 15 seconds after the recoil-activation.

Steps

- 1. In the menu, select is and press the wheel to confirm.
- 2. Rotate the wheel to switch the prerecording time. 7 s, 10 s, and 15 s are selectable.
- 3. Hold the wheel to save and exit.

iNote

If the device recoils continuously, the device will record the 7, 10 or 15 seconds before the first recoil and end recording the 7, 10, or 15 seconds after the last recoil.

What to do next

For exporting recording files, refer to Export Files.

6.4 Export Files

This function is used to export recorded videos and captured pictures.

6.4.1 Export Files via HIKMICRO Sight

You can access device albums and export files to your phone via HIKMICRO Sight.

Before You Start

Install HIKMICRO Sight on your mobile phone.

Steps

- 1. Open HIKMICRO Sight and connect your device to the app. See *App Connection*.
- 2. Tap Media to access device albums.




Figure 6-2 Access Device Album

- 3. Tap Local or Device to view the photos and videos.
 - Local: You can view the previous files on the app.

- **Device**: You can view the files of the current device.

iNote

The photos or videos may not show in **Device**. Please pull down to refresh the page.

4. Tap to select a file, and tap **Download** to export the file to your local phone albums.

6.4.2 Export Files via PC

Steps

1. Connect the device and PC with a Type-C cable.

iNote

Make sure the device is turned on when connecting the cable.

- Open computer disk and select the disk of device. Go to the DCIM folder and find the folder named after the capture year and month. For example, if you capture a picture or record a video in June 2022, go to DCIM > 202206 to find the picture or video.
- 3. Select and copy the files to PC.
- 4. Disconnect the device from your PC.

□iNote

- The device displays images when you connect it to PC, but functions such as recording, capturing and hotspot are disabled.
- When you connect the device to PC for the first time, it installs the drive program automatically.

Chapter 7 System Settings

7.1 Adjust Date

Steps

- 1. In the menu, select 🧿 General Settings, and press the wheel to enter the sub-menu.
- 2. Select 📋 .
- 3. Press the wheel to select the year, month, or day, and rotate the wheel to change the number.
- 4. Hold the wheel to save settings and exit.

7.2 Synchronize Time

Steps

- 1. In the menu, select 🧿 General Settings, and press the wheel to enter the sub-menu.
- 2. Select 🕓 .

Press and rotate the wheel to switch the clock system. 24-hour and 12-hour clock are selectable. If you select 12-hour clock, press and rotate the wheel to select AM or PM.
Press the wheel to select the hour or minute, and rotate the wheel to change the number.

5. Hold the wheel to save settings and exit.

7.3 Set Language

You can select the device language in this function.

Steps

- 1. In the menu, select **O** General Settings, and press the wheel to enter the sub-menu.
- 2. Select (), and press the wheel to enter the language configuration interface.
- 3. Rotate the wheel to select the language as required, and press the wheel to confirm.
- 4. Hold the wheel to exit.

7.4 Set Unit

You can switch the unit for the distance measurement function and the reticle function.

Steps

- 1. In the menu, select **O** General Settings, and press the wheel to enter the sub-menu.
- 2. Select > , and press the wheel to confirm.
- 3. Rotate the wheel to select yard or m.
- 4. Hold the wheel to save settings and exit.

7.5 View Device Information

- 1. In the menu, select **O** General Settings, and press the wheel to enter the sub-menu.
- 2. Select (i), and press the wheel. You can view the device information such as version and serial No.

7.6 Restore Device

Steps

- 1. In the menu, select **O** General Settings, and press the wheel to enter the sub-menu.
- 2. Select signal of the select select select the device to defaults according to the prompt.

Chapter 8 Frequently Asked Questions

8.1 Why is the monitor off?

Check the following items.

- Check whether the device is off-battery.
- Check the monitor after charging the device for 5 minutes.

8.2 The image is not clear, how to adjust it?

Adjust the diopter adjustment ring or focus ring until the image is clear. Refer to *Adjust Diopter* or *Adjust Focus*.

8.3 Capturing or recording fails. What's the problem?

Check the following items.

- Whether the device is connected to your PC. Capturing or recording is disabled in this status.
- Whether the storage space is full.
- Whether the device is low-battery.

8.4 Why the PC cannot identify the device?

Check the following items.

- Whether the device is connected to your PC with supplied USB cable.
- If you use other USB cables, make sure the cable length is no longer than 1 m.

Safety Instruction

These instructions are intended to ensure that user can use the product correctly to avoid danger or property loss.

Transportation

- DO NOT drop the product or subject it to physical shock. Keep the device away from magnetic interference.

Power Supply

- Please purchase the charger by yourself. Input voltage should meet the Limited Power Source (5 VDC, 2A) according to the IEC61010-1 standard. Please refer to technical specifications for detailed information.
- Make sure the plug is properly connected to the power socket.
- DO NOT connect multiple devices to one power adapter, to avoid over-heating or fire hazards caused by overload.
- The power source should meet limited power source or PS2 requirements according to

IEC 62368-1 standard.

• Use the power adapter provided by qualified manufacturer. Refer to the product specification for detailed power requirements.

Battery

- Improper use or replacement of the battery may result in explosion hazard. Replace with the same or equivalent type only.
- The built-in battery type is 18650 with the protection board, and the battery size should be 23 mm × 67 mm. The rated voltage and capacity are 3.6 VDC/3350 mAh (12.18 Wh).
- The external removable battery type is CR123A, and the max. rated voltage and capacity are 3 VDC and 1600 mAh. Dispose of used batteries in conformance with the instructions provided by the battery manufacturer.
- Use the battery provided by qualified manufacturer. Refer to the product specification for detailed battery requirements.
- Make sure the battery temperature is between 0 °C to 45 °C (32 °F to 113 °F) when charging.
- Install the external battery before the built-in battery runs out, or the device cannot be turned on.
- Confirm there is no flammable material within 2 m of the charger during charging.
- DO NOT place the battery near heating or fire source. Avoid direct sunlight.
- DO NOT place the battery in the reach of children.

Maintenance

- If the product does not work properly, please contact your dealer or the nearest service center. We shall not assume any responsibility for problems caused by unauthorized repair or maintenance.
- Wipe the device gently with a clean cloth and a small quantity of ethanol, if necessary.
- If the equipment is used in a manner not specified by the manufacturer, the protection provided by the device may be impaired.
- It is recommended to reboot the device every 2 hours when using it to ensure the device performance.

Using Environment

- Make sure the running environment meets the requirement of the device. The operating temperature shall be between -30 °C to 55 °C (-22 °F to 131 °F), and the relative humidity shall be 5% to 95%.
- DO NOT expose the device to high electromagnetic radiation or dusty environments.
- DO NOT aim the lens at the sun or any other bright light.
- Place the device in a dry and well-ventilated environment.
- When any laser equipment is in use, make sure that the device lens is not exposed to the laser beam, or it may burn out.

Emergency

If smoke, odor, or noise arises from the device, immediately turn off the power, unplug the power cable, and contact the service center.
